One of the speakers suggested we need to start asking God questions rather than Church questions. God's dreams for us is the 'Why' question, the Holy Spirit at work is the 'How' question and the 'What' is us as the Church.

As we enter into summertime and this Eastertide, I encourage us to start with the Why of God's dream for us.



Pastor's Report

- Pastor Joe's upcoming schedule is as follows: April 27-May 1 at NACCC Minister's Convocation in Racine. July 13-19 WCA Camp Wautoma probably will be gone two of those days.
- New Membership Sunday will be on Sunday, May 18th.
- Pastor Joe will participate in the Memorial Day ceremony in Rochester.

Treasurer Report

- Deposited offerings in March were \$5958.00.
- Both capital projects completed, with the steeple project being completed exactly as quoted although Waldron Woodworks performed additional roof and other work. Total for capital projects was \$71,608.

The Heritage of Faith



Christians everywhere share a faith grounded in common roots: belief in God and the salvation of His Christ, truth as expressed in the Bible, and doctrines developed in the early church. Many don't, however, know much of where those last two came from. That is what we are going to explore.

This short 6-week course will start with a basic timeline of where our Bible came from and continue with exploration of the development of five of the universal church's root doctrines concerning creation, original sin, sacraments, predestination, and the Trinity. We will do this using original source material, principally the Bible and the writings of Augustine, then comparing how the doctrines have developed into modern use. The study's purpose is not to promote any specific denominational position, but to better understand from where various positions have grown, how they do or do not agree with what we have been taught, and provide room for us to better understand our own beliefs.
