

December 2023





The first is the lighting of the Community Christmas Tree – a beautiful spruce tree planted earlier this month. The Lighting event will be on Friday, December 1st at 6:30 pm. Candlelight, Carols, and the Countdown are a great way to initiate this festive season. But also, to top off the evening, the Madrigal Singers from Waterford Union High School will perform at 7:00 pm - as they have for the past many years. These singers are as good and entertaining as they come! Refreshments follow with warm apple cider and Christmas cookies of every kind.

For the four Sundays of Advent, I plan to bring messages that help us understand how God orchestrated the advent (coming) of His Son into the world to bring salvation. After the morning service - (which is all about carols of Christmas – no sermon), we will enjoy a potluck luncheon followed by a festive round of 'Robber Bingo'. Everyone brings a gift to put out on a table, it can be any kind of gift - a gag, a white elephant, or a regifted - and who knows where it ends up after a few rounds of cutthroat Robber Bingo. Choir Practice


Choir practice will meet each week on Wednesday nights at 7:00 pm.

Pastors Report

- Annual meeting scheduled for January 28, 2024.

Treasurer's Report

- Sent Samaritan's Purse \$250 for shipping costs for shoe boxes
- Reserves stand at \$101,670, up 6% to last year
- Attendance average is 34/Sunday, up 5 from last year
- We will use the landscaping fund to pay for the new tree.
- Bought a new lamp for the sanctuary piano. Laura is very happy with it.
